02. BRIEF HISTORY OF RAJASTHAN

Rajasthan which is also known as the “Land of Maharajas” is the largest state of India, covering an area of about 3,42,239 sq. km. It comprises of 33 districts and its largest city is Jaipur, which is also its capital. Being located on the western side of the country, it shares its border with Pakistan to its northwest and to the west it shares its border with Sindh. To its north it has Punjab, Uttar Pradesh and Haryana to its northeast; to its southeast it has Madhya Pradesh and Gujarat to its southwest.

The glory of the state is retained by its majestic palaces, forts and monuments. The vibrant culture and rich heritage of this princely state draw innumerable tourists from across the globe.

Its major attractions include the ruins of Indus Valley Civilization, the oldest mountain range- Aravalli, a Jain pilgrimage site known as Dilwara Temples, Karni Mata Mandir, the only hill station of Rajasthan- Mount Abu, Keoladeo National Park (formerly known as Bharatpur National Park, the Ranthambore National Park and the Sariska Tiger Reserve.

Some of its major architectural wonders include Chittorgarh fort - the largest fort in Asia, Mehrangarh Fort at Jodhpur, Jaipur “The Pink City” houses a number of well known tourists spots which include Hawa Mahal (Palace of Winds), Lake Palace, City Palace, Amber Palace, Jantar Mantar, Umaid Bhawan in Jodhpur, Jaisalmer Fort in Jaisalmer and many more.

Not only this, the princely state of Rajasthan hosts varied colorful fairs and festivals which are known for their uniqueness and captivates a large number of tourists from India and overseas every year, some of which are Pushkar Fair, Jaipur Literature Festival, Jodhpur Flamenco Gypsy Festival, Jaipur Heritage International Festival, Desert Festival, Urs at Ajmer, Teej and many more to give you a whole new experience.



03. GLIMPSES OF RAJASTHAN

Rajasthan the most colorful state of India. If you are one of those who love the colors and cultures of places, then this is a never-miss place. And mind you, if you thought Rajasthan is only about opulent palaces and forts, you are totally mistaken – there is lot more that the place offers than you can even imagine. Every city is special in its own way and it has a unique name too: Jaipur is the 'Pink City', Jaisalmer the 'Golden City', Jodhpur is 'Sun City' while the beautiful Udaipur is called the 'Lake City'. JAIPUR : Jaipur is the also known as 'Pink City'. Pink city visiting places-City Palace, Albert Hall, Amer Fort, Jal Mahal, Hawa Mahal, Jantar Mantar, Nahargarh & many more historical & religions places.

BIKANER : Its more known for the 'namkeen' and 'rasgullas'. On the outskirts of the city is the Karni Mata Temple. In this temple rats are considered holy and you can see millions of them running all around.

JAISALMER : Its also known as the golden city. Look around every building is built using yellow stone. Another thing you should not miss is the sunset/sunrise at sand dunes and the camel ride. Kuldhara village is another attraction in Jaisalmer, along with other palaces and forts.

- Arrival & Departure** : Contingents are requested to report at Jamboree site on 3rd January, 2023 before 10.00 A.M. (First Rehearsal for inauguration will start at 2:00 P.M. soon after lunch. Late comers may not get representation in the Opening Ceremony) Contingents will be allowed to depart from Jamboree after getting “No due Certificate” from Sub-Camp Chief on 10th January, 2023 afternoon i.e. after Valedictory Function.
- Railway Assistance** : North Western Railway authorities will open a booth in Jamboree city for assistance in return reservations.
- Passes and Permission** : Identity Card or Pass is a must for everybody in the Jamboree city. Scouts and Guides, Rovers and Rangers will not be permitted to go out of the Jamboree area. However, contingent staff members only with the permission of the contingent leader for local work can obtain passes from the security counter for going out to the town. All supporting staff will be provided with identity card to facilitate their movement in Jamboree area.



DETAILED INFORMATION OF JAMBOREE

Day Visitors: Hamare Atithi

Visitors are allowed on prior permission from the Jamboree Director/Jamboree Secretary. One of the main purpose of the Jamboree will be able to tell and show others what we do and how we live in the camps. As we are expecting good number of visitors for various functions, it is also possible that some interested public may go round and see camps. Each visitor must be introduced by an officer of BSG., through proper prescribed form at least 15 days before the start of the Jamboree so that each Visitor can be given a Visitor Pass.

School Students of the town (Jodhpur/Pali) will be allowed from 09:00 A.M. to 09:00 P.M. However, 15 days before the Jamboree, the list of students & teachers and timing of visit must be given by the concerned school to the Jamboree Secretary. Students & Teachers will be given visitors pass each along with the name, email address & cell number of the accompanying teachers and the Principal of the School.

We should not only plan for the security but also train a number of Scouts/Guides in each contingent to guide the visitors and to explain our activities and programme to them. There will be volunteers to receive the 'ATITHI' at the reception centre.



07. COMPOSITION OF STATE CONTINGENTS

EACH PARTICIPATING STATE CONTINGENT SHALL COMPRISE OF THE FOLLOWING:

❖ **Contingent Leader – One for Scout Wing, One for Guide Wing**
Jamboree Duties of the Contingent Leaders:

- ☞ To lead the Contingent to the Jamboree and get the members registered well in advance through format already supplied from the National Headquarters.
- ☞ To be responsible for the discipline, punctuality and orderliness of the Contingent.
- ☞ To be always available with the Contingent and encourage each one of the member to participate in all the activities of the Jamboree in correct and complete uniform or as suggested.
- ☞ To arrange as far as possible patrol Cooking and to maintain the camping standards.
- ☞ To divide the work among Scouters and Guiders and take full advantage of their presence.
- ☞ To take personal care at the time of morning Inspection, paying special emphasis on gadgets and gateway etc. and ensure cleanliness all through.
- ☞ To arrange security of the properties of the members of the contingent turn by turn round the clock.
- ☞ To assist the Sub-Camp Chief in all possible ways.
- ☞ To see that the members of the contingent follow the daily Routine while taking part in all the activities.
- ☞ To participate every day in contingent Leaders Meeting announced from time to time and pass on information to the members of the contingent to act upon.
- ☞ To get Clearance Certificate from the Sub-Camp Chief before departure.
- ☞ To see that the members follow all other instructions given from time to time by the Jamboree Authorities.



- ☛ To ensure that when the uniform is worn, it is worn completely and correctly.
 - ☛ When in mufti, the members of the contingent should wear State/Jamboree scarf/ ID card for identification.
 - ☛ To create opportunities for the members to visit other states and exchange ideas and skills.
- ❖ **Deputy Contingent Leader** – One for Scout Wing, One for Guide Wing. Jamboree Duties of the Deputy Contingent Leaders:
- ☛ Shall assist the contingent leader in discharging his/her duties
 - ☛ Shall be in charge of the contingent in the absence of Contingent Leader
 - ☛ Shall report to the Contingent Leader.
- ❖ **Quarter Master** – One for Scout Wing, One for Guide Wing
- Jamboree Duties of the Quarter Master:
- ☛ Will be responsible for all materialistic requirements of the Jamboree.
 - ☛ Will be responsible for setting up of kitchen for State Contingent and plan menu during the Jamboree.
 - ☛ Will ensure timely serving of meal to every participant and each meal comprising of balanced diet.
 - ☛ Ensures hygiene of the kitchen to avoid any food related health issues that may arise.
 - ☛ Will be responsible for all purchasing necessary requisites to run the kitchen.
 - ☛ Shall report to the Contingent Leader on daily updates and expenses.



❖ **Deputy Quarter Master**—One for Scout Wing, One for Guide Wing.

Jamboree Duties of the Deputy Quarter Master:

- ☞ Shall assist the Quarter Master in discharging his/her duties.
- ☞ Shall discharge the duties of Quarter Master in his/her absence or as per the instruction of Quarter Master.
- ☞ Shall report to the quarter master.

❖ **Activity Leader**—One for Scout Wing, One for Guide Wing Shall be responsible for timely participation of State Contingent as per schedule and location.

❖ **Jamboree Duties of the Activity Leaders :**

- ☞ Shall ensure preparation of contingent participation in terms of selection, event briefing and any other preparation that may be required.
- ☞ May identify leaders for each activity from among the Scouts / Guides giving them an opportunity to shoulder the responsibility.
- ☞ Shall report to the contingent leader providing a daily brief on participation and outcomes.

❖ **Transport In Charge** – One for Scout Wing, One for Guide Wing Shall be responsible for making necessary communication and arrangements related to transportation of the participating contingents.

A collage of various items including a large camouflage duffel bag, a purple messenger bag, a green and blue baseball cap, a black belt with a buckle, a purple polo shirt, a tan polo shirt, a dark blue short-sleeved shirt, a dark blue long-sleeved shirt, a dark blue jacket, a brown hat, a gold hat, and several lanyards. The items are arranged on a white background with faint watermarks.

Musical instruments, Emergency light, First Aid Box etc. Cooking gas cylinders at cost will be made available in the Jamboree market area. Provision to supply firewood is also being earmarked but it is suggested that please avoid using fire-wood as much as possible keeping safety measures in view. The advance party can procure & install them at the allotted area of the Kitchen.



State wise separate place for cooking will be allotted with running water & light facility. Cooking will not be allowed in the Sub-Camp areas or any other places. Gas

cylinders and Fire-Wood will be made available in the Jamboree Ground for hiring and purchasing.



CENTRAL CAFETERIA

There will be a central cafeteria for Jamboree identified staff, guests, overseas contingents & service Rovers and Rangers. Food coupons will be issued at the time of registration.

REGISTRATION & ALLOTMENT

Registration of the participants of each State will only be done in advance on the basis of the information provided to the states by the National Headquarters in a prescribed format. The filled up formats from the States should reach the Bharat Scouts and Guides, National Headquarters, New Delhi on or before 31st October, 2022, so that identity cards can be issued to participants on arrival.





The allotment of the accommodation will also be done through the computer, based on the quota allotted and of contingent attending. It would be more convenient if the States remit their Scout/Guide Welfare Fund contribution in advance to the National Headquarters according to the list of the participants. Sending the formats before 20 November, 2022 is a must. Contingents will be given their Souvenir kit on arrival at Jamboree Ground by the host Rajasthan State Bharat Scouts and Guides. This will avoid long waiting near the entrance of the Jamboree Camp. Without ID, contingents will not be allowed into the Sub-Camp.

NO SINGLE USE PLASTIC

Avoid using single use plastic materials such as carry bags, plastic spoons, plates, bottles etc. Bring your own steel plate, steel tumbler, steel spoon, jute bag, paper bag etc.



KITCHEN FACILITIES

State will have a separate places for cooking in an allotted slot with water and light facility.

Gas cylinders and stoves will be made available on cost of hiring.

ADVANCE PARTY

Sending a responsible advance party will be very helpful to collect all information and do registration work etc. They should arrive at least two days earlier at the Jamboree ground and contact Jamboree Office preferably on 2nd January, 2023.

SIGHT SEEING

- ☞ There will be a separate sightseeing office setup by the Tourism Department and R. S. R.T.C. at the Jamboree site.
- ☞ The contingents may register their sightseeing program on cost
- ☞ Details will be provided by the Department



Rajasthan State Road Transport Corporation/Rajasthan State Tourism Department shall provide the bus required for sight-seeing based on contingent's requirement. The Price of hiring a bus for sightseeing is as follows:

1. Bus with seating capacity of 50 candidates. From Jamboree Venue upto 300 km. both side travel @400₹ each candidate.
2. Other Vehicles Rates / Charges will be applied according/ as per approved rates by Jamboree transport committee.

FACILITIES AT JAMBOREE SITE

JAMBOREE MARKET

❖ BANK WITH ATM

- Jamboree official Bank – State Bank of India (SBI) starts functioning from 3rd January, 2023.
- The Bank will have service of foreign exchange, travellers cheques and ATM also.

POST OFFICE

There will be a Jamboree Post Office functioning from 3rd January, 2023. The Letter Box will be set-up at the center points and will be cleared on daily basis.

TELEPHONE

ISD/STD/Local Telephone services will be made available along with the sufficient recharging unit.



SUPER MARKET

A Super Market will be established to supply all provisions, like spices, oil, salt, sugar, dairy products, fruits, vegetables, cosmetics, medicines, sanitary items etc.




Projects and vessels will be made available on hiring basis :

Drinking water facility is being set up at the Jamboree site and will be made available to all the participants sufficiently. Contingents are requested to educate participants on “not to waste water”.


SANITATION

FIRE SAFETY



Fire department will depute fire tenders at the Jamboree site.

Areas will be marked as assembly points and fire tenders will be located at identified critical locations to ensure the safety of every individual in case of an untoward incident.



HEALTH SAFETY

- There will be a 50 bedded camp hospital in Jamboree city, service team of qualified doctors and nurses will be available round the clock.
- Two Dispensaries will also be set-up with a team of qualified doctors and nurses to meet any emergency in the Sub-Camps.
- First-Aid booths will be made available in the identified areas such as Sub-Camps, activity areas etc.
- All state contingents are requested to carry their first aid box.



EQUIPMENT STORE

Supply Service of the Scout/Guide equipment, books, badges, souvenir items will be operated in the Jamboree city only by the Bharat Scouts and Guides, National Headquarters.



LOST & FOUND

- Lost and Found articles are reported through the contingent leaders to the information office of the Jamboree.
- In case of any item is found, please deposit at the lost and found center.



INDIVIDUAL ACTIVITIES

List of Individual Activities will be given in Jamboree booklet, which will be issued at the time of Registration of the contingent at the Jamboree Ground. Kindly ensure that every Scout/Guide gets an opportunity to participate and get the award. Do not forget to equip the Scouts/Guides with a backpack, rucksack, water bottle, Torch, Scout Knife and a rope etc. Please ensure that participant will carry packed dinner, sleeping bag/sleeping mat etc. for the Night Hike.



09. GROUP ACTIVITIES – WING WISE

THESE ACTIVITIES WILL BE DONE IN THE SUB-CAMP AREA AND ARENA

CAMP FIRE

Camp fire will be judged separately, wing wise in the Sub Camps. Theme, originality, the role, expressions, costumes, make up, presentation and instruments or material used, are the areas to be observed. Adult Leader will not be allowed in the presentation for competition. Minimum number of participants in camp fire will be eight.



As far as the Grand Camp fire is concerned, items will be selected out of the items given by the States in the Camp fire competition. If any State is bringing common camp fire item where Scouts and Guides are equally participating such item may be considered for Grand Camp fire, by seeing the performance and presentability of the item, but not for the competition purpose.

(MAXIMUM TIME 4 MINUTES).

CAMP CRAFT

Every day there will be a morning Camp Inspection, organized by the Sub-Camp Chief. Uniform and turnout of the contingent, tent and layout, Gadgets and pits, decoration and cleanliness of the Sub-Camp.

STATE GATE

Each State is expected to prepare their Gate separately wing wise. Collection of required material to prepare gate is the responsibility of the State. Proportion, beauty, skill, originality, material used and special attraction of the gate will be observed. Metal frames, use of Nut-Bolts will disqualify the project. Judgement will take place for all





days. The competition will start from 4th January to 6th January. Judgement will be on 6th January at 16:00 hours.

SCOUT GUIDE SKILLS

- Patrol Pioneering, Camp Craft.
- Signalling—Morse & Semaphore.
- First Aid.
- Estimation.
- Tent pitching maximum 5 patrols of 9 Scouts each and 5 Patrols of 9 Guides each from one state will participate in the above competitions.


PIONEERING PROJECT FOR SCOUT ONLY

Scouts will prepare Pioneering Projects i.e. one only. Adult Leaders can also help the Scouts in preparing pioneering projects. Usefulness, correctness of knots and lashings, skill involved, cleanliness in building, size of the prepared pioneering project will be observed.

Collection of the material for preparing pioneering project is the primary responsibility of the State. Jamboree authorities will make available of ballies, lathis, bamboos etc. on rental/sale basis in the market area. The competition will start from 4th January to 6th January. Judgement will be on 6th January at 14:30 hours.

RANGOLI FOR GUIDES ONLY

Guides will prepare Rangoli in the designated place i.e. one only. One Patrol of Guides can be deputed for Rangoli Competition. Rangoli can be prepared with any materials and present their talent. Theme, skill involved, materials used, size & design of art, authenticity will be observed. The competition will start from 4th January to 6th January. Judgement will be on 6th January at 14:30 hours.





❖ MARCH PAST

32 members including leader will be allowed to participate in March Past. No adult leader will participate. The platoon will march in Threes. Salute, Commands, Smartness, Leadership, Uniformity and correct marching will be observed. The composition will be as under:

❖ BAND

Each State contingent will be allowed to bring with them one Band party wing wise. Presenting the mixed Band is also allowed. Band parties will be judged separately.

One Adult Leader will be allowed to guide the Band team but the





Scout/Guide only will lead the team in the competition. Where Band parties are mixed, marks will be given to both the wings seeing the number of the Scouts and Guides, if number of Scouts and Guides in the Band party are equal, equal marks will be given to both the wings. Each band party may have their own ceremonial dress but in the competition, only Scout/Guide uniform will be allowed. Duration maximum 10 mins.

No of participants for the competition :

Minimum : 15 Scouts + 1 Leader + 1 placard holder = 17
or mixed Team

Maximum : 30 Scouts + 1 Leader + 1 placard holder = 32

PHYSICAL DISPLAY

Physical display will be judged wing-wise in the arena. Minimum number of the participants in display will be 18. No Adult Leader will be allowed to participate in physical display, but Band rhythm or musical support can be given by the Adults. Subject of Physical Display will be selected by the State. Originality, Presentation, Uniformity, Skill, Leadership and Gymnastic value in physical exercise will be judged by the experts in this field. Duration maximum 3 to 5 minutes.



❖ COLOUR PARTY

Each state contingent will be allowed to bring one Colour party of five members. They should wear Scout/Guide uniform with white gloves and anklets.

Flag bearer may wear leather carrier belt. Colour party should be made up of 3 Scouts and 2 Guides or vice versa. Three in front column, the one to the left carrying the Association Flag of the Bharat Scouts & Guides and to the right carrying the National Flag.

❖ For formation & Ceremonial Dresses, "Drill & March Past" & "APRO-I" to be followed.



Flag will be on Flag staff of each 7 feet long. Flag top 10 cm. Width be used. Flag staff be held by the right hand at the mouth level with palm inwards and forearm at right angles to Flag staff. Points which will be observed for judgment of standard of the colour party are marching, carrying position, of Flag marching when entering to the saluting base, opening Flag and gathering Flag while passing saluting base, correct uniform, leadership and smartness. No adult Leader will be allowed with the colour party.



PAGEANT SHOW

States are requested to come prepared for this spectacular procession. The Pageant Show to the glorious historical movement in the History of our State, C.D. Activities, C.D. Project of the State, cultural exposition of the State may be other subjects for the Pageant Show. This is up to the State Contingent to decide the subject for the Pageant Show. There is no limit of number of the participants. Adults may also play their best role in making the pageant show live.



Performance will be judged by the panel of judges. Originality, costume, liveliness, self-explanatory theme in display, way of presentation, will be observed. Each state will be given three minutes for introduction of the pageant show. Only one person from the state will be allowed for commentary. Play back singing should not disturb the show of others.



FOOD PLAZA

Cooking dishes and serving them to a person will be a thrilling experience. People will know the special dishes of your State. You can also explain how to prepare your traditional dishes. A chart of ingredients may also be put up. Duration 3 hours (from 9:00 A.M. to 12:00 P.M.).

FOLK DANCE

There will be a folk dance festival which will be judged in the arena. Scouts and Guides may participate jointly. Minimum number of participants in the folk dance will be 18. No adult leader will be allowed to participate in the folk dance but adult leader may help by playing music and singing the song for the dance. Cultural originality,



traditional costumes, uniformity, make-up, melodious song with traditional local music, instruments & presentation will be observed. Best items for valedictory function or grand camp fire will be selected and included in the programme. (Maximum Time 4 Minutes).

ETHNIC FASHION SHOW

In this Jamboree, an ethnic fashion Show is being planned in which each participating contingent will depute a selected one Scout and One Guide to show case cultural tradition of the respective State and walk on a ramp. This is a joint competition which coincide's with the International Night.



ROUTE MARCH/INTEGRATION MARCH :

A Route March/Integration March with around selected 5000 scouts and guides accompanied by adult leaders will be carried out in Jodhpur city. The purpose of the route march will be to promote the spirit of scouting / guiding and spread the message of movement as well as commemorate 'Azadi Ka Amrit Mohatsav'.

The route march will be for a distance of around 3-4 kilometers and participants will carry along placards containing slogans based on scouting / guiding or Jamboree theme, slogan based on National integration, Peace & Harmony. Global Development Village or GDV/Skill-O-Rama is a unique feature of our Jamboree which is very educative for Scouts & Guides as well as to the observers. Demonstration of Proficiency badges, skills and handicrafts, Art, Drawing and painting etc. will be the activities





under Global Development Village/ Skill-O-Rama. All the States will put up their performance in the exhibition area on the allotted day, but all items will be kept throughout the Jamboree period for everybody including visitors to see and appreciate. No adult leader will be allowed to participate in this activity. Two hours for preparation & presentation will be given to the participants. Name plate or banners of the subjects will be allowed. State will be provided with electricity connection on demand in advance to the in-charge for Global Development Village/ Skill-O-Rama.

Knowledge, usefulness, skill, cleanliness, presentation, explanation of the skill and preparedness will be observed.

The participants may participate in at least 05 activities. One Patrol of Scouts and One Patrol of Guides to be deputed in the designated place.

Following are the list of activities proposed :

1. Woggle Making
2. Yoga
3. HAM Radio
4. Mat Weaving
5. Rangoli
6. Friendship Band
7. Drawing/Painting/Creative Art
8. Best Out of Waste (Eg.: using paper, cloth etc.)

All the required materials for this activity shall be brought by the Contingent only.

This activity will be held for the duration of 120 minutes.



STATE EXHIBITION

The Jamboree will have an exhibition set up where participants will be able to display their exhibits.

Exhibits may be any of the following :

- Depict culture of the state
- Highlight value add done by scouts / guides in the community
- Handicrafts prepared by the participant
- Collection of stamps, currency etc
- Scientific experiments that can be demonstrated
- Models to display
- Any other

The duration of the event shall be 120 minutes where participants will have an opportunity to visit and interact at stalls.

Participating contingents shall arrange for the necessary materials required.

YOGA MORNING UNDER FIT INDIA INITIATIVES :

The morning of 6th January, 2023 will be marked as Yoga morning in the Jamboree. Each state shall depute 18 Scouts and 18 Guides to participate in yoga morning in respective Sub-Camps. This activity will be arranged under the leadership of respective Sub-Camp Chief.

ALL FAITHS PRAYER

All faiths prayer will be held in the arena on 10th of January, 2023 at 7:00 A.M. All state contingents to brief participants on the importance of the event and discipline to be followed. Practice in this regard for participants will be appreciated. Each state is to depute two patrols of Scouts and two patrols of Guides to participate.





YOUTH IN ACTION

PATROL IN COUNCIL

Opportunity for participants to express their views on the theme “Progress for Peace” will be provided through patrol in council.

Each state shall depute a patrol of Scouts and Guides to participate in the event. The event shall be executed in three parts

1. Each patrol shall discuss on activities their state shall take up in next one year based on the theme and need in their respective state – Duration: 20 minutes.
2. Representative from each state (Patrol Leader) shall then present a summary of their discussion within 1 minute to the audience – Duration: 60 minutes
3. Conclusion – An appreciation of efforts put in by participants to be delivered with a conclusive note based on discussion by the organizing leader

TROOP / COMPANY LEADERS CONFERENCE

This Jamboree will create a forum where a troop leader and a company leader from each state shall participate to discuss the outcome of patrol – in – council and shape it to execution. This event will be held for the 2nd time in a National Jamboree.

Participants of this conference shall be further continuing as a representative from the state to co-ordinate on action plan committed to ensuring execution towards conclusion rather than concluding at discussion.

PROGRESSION OF EVENT SHALL BE AS FOLLOWS :

Total duration of event shall be 90 minutes with break up as follows:

1. Identification of chairman, secretary and scribe through self-proposal and conference acceptance – 10 minutes.
2. Based on the outcome of patrol – in – council and present action plan for each state – 1 minute per state – Duration: 60 minutes.
3. The chairman of the conference shall then handover the committed action plan to the event organizer for follow-up actions by the National Youth Committee.



The National Youth Committee shall then ensure execution of committed plan through regular communication and follow-up.

A copy of the conclusive action plan shall be submitted to Chief National Commissioner and all State Chief Commissioners for their kind attention and action.

OUTCOME:

1. Chain of young and responsible leaders across the country.
2. A sense of responsibility will ensure their role in growth of movement at various levels.
3. Execution of activity will ensure keeping alive the spirit of Jamboree theme in action.

YOUTH FORUM

Each participating state shall depute 2 Scouts and 2 Guides to take part in the Youth Forum. The forum consisting of the participants along with the National Youth Committee shall identify a scribe and a facilitator while the chairman of the youth forum shall chair this discussion.

Scribe shall take minutes of discussion and facilitator shall assist the chairman in every possible way to ensure smooth and qualitative progression of discussion.

The topic of discussion for youth forum shall be – “What change do you require in the present Scout and Guide Uniform”.

The duration of activity shall be 90 minutes with break-up as follows

- Assembly, settling down, Identification of scribe and facilitator – 10 minutes.
- Introductory game – 20 minutes.
- Discussion – 40 minutes.
- Conclusion – 20 minutes.

The conclusive note on this discussion along with minutes shall be handed over by the chairman to the Chief National Commissioner for further action.



10. ADULT LEADER ACTIVITIES

HWB HOLDERS RE-UNION & TRAINER'S MEET :

A Wood Badge holders and Trainer's Meet will be held during the Jamboree. All state contingent leaders are requested to share the list of eligible participants in advance allowing necessary preparation for the event.

BLOOD DONATION CAMP

To inculcate the sense of importance, blood donation has in the society, a blood donation camp will be held for "ADULTS" only who are 18 years and above with minimum weight 50 kg. and health condition as prescribed by the medical team onsite. Adults may include Rovers, Rangers, Unit leaders and possibly those visiting the Jamboree.

Considering the number of adults participating in the event, we envisage a collection of at least 501 units which will be channelized through relevant organizations to the needful.

JAMBOREE MEDIA TEAM

Being an event for the young, the Jamboree media team will be formed involving one Rover / Ranger / Scout / Guide nominated by each state for the purpose. The role of media team will be to collect the jamboree day to day happenings and publish them through jamboree Patrika/News Bulletin. They will work in collaboration with qualified media team giving them an opportunity to learn on the topic.



Request each state to depute one Scout and one Guide from among the participants for the purpose.



DESERT TREKKING

Place for desert trekking has been earmarked which is 104 K.M. from the Jamboree site. One has to pay the bus fare and proceed to enjoy Desert Trekking, Camel Safari etc. and return back on the same day.

WORLD SCOUT VILLAGE & WORLD GUIDE VILLAGE

The World Scout & Guide village is organized for connecting young people from across the country and abroad. Participants have the chance to develop physically, intellectually and socially while contributing to their communities. The SDG Hub will be an experiment of blending the needs of current generations, post pandemic challenges, youth trends and to keep the core values intact and align to contribute to the sustainable development goals.

In the SDG Hub all young people will have a learning and sharing experience of each SOG's and how they relate it by contributing in their daily life to change the world to a better place of living. Various activities and initiatives what Scouts/Guides for SOG is contributing will be the major activities to enable the young people to understand how they can learn and participate in the activities to be an active global citizen to create a better world. We have activities of WOSM flagship programmes like Earth Tribe, Dialogue for Peace, Inter Religious Dialogue, Messengers of Peace, Scouts of the World Award, Scouts Go Solar, Dialogue for Peace. Subsequently programs of WAGGGS like Free-Being Me, Surf Smart 2.0, Her World Her Voice, U-Reporter, Stop the Violence, Plastic Tide Turner Challenge, Red Pride Menstrual Hygiene Awareness etc.



11. AWARDS AND CERTIFICATES

INDIVIDUAL ACTIVITIES

For Individual Activities, a special rubber seal for each activity will be made available at the activity base. On successful completion of each award activity, seal will be marked on Jamboree award card. On successful completion of Jamboree award activities, card will be collected at the office of the Sub-Camp chief and Jamboree award will be handed over to the State Contingent Leader of the respective wing for further distribution to the winners.

GROUP ACTIVITIES

For Group and Joint Group Activities, Grade Certificates with Pennant will be given to the State / NSOs achieving Grade "A". State Achieving highest marks in group activities in each wing will be awarded "Chief Commissioner's Shield".

JOINT ACTIVITIES

The State achieving the highest marks in Joint Group activities will be awarded Chief National Commissioner Flag.

All activities of the Jamboree are award oriented with the objective of ensuring participation and encouragement to all delegates.

FIRST DAY POSTAL COVER

To mark the beginning of Jamboree, first day cover and commemorative stamps will be released based on the theme of scouting / guiding and Jamboree.

EXCHANGE CORNER/SWAPPING

An exchange corner will be set up where participants can exchange variety of badges, woggles, scarves and any other memorabilia that they may wish to. Eg.: Woggle of their district camporee, state jamboree may be exchanged with participants from other states and overseas countries.

The intention is to promote the brotherhood/sisterhood while exchanging the views on various activities held and their themes.



12. OTHER ATTRACTIONS

FOLLOWING ARE THE OTHER ATTRACTIONS OF THE JAMBOREE :

YOUNG LEADERS : AAJ KA YUVA

To boost the enthusiasm, discipline Force of the Youth, many young leaders, scientists and personalities of the games and sports field will be visiting the Jamboree on different dates.

EXHIBITION :

Besides the exhibition of the State, other Government agencies of Rajasthan, Defense and other organizations will arrange their exhibition of educational values in Jamboree city.

ARTISANS INDIA :

Artisans from different parts of Rajasthan will be invited to demonstrate various traditional crafts of the State in the Jamboree.

AIR SHOW :

Air show by Indian Air Force, Jodhpur may be organized during the Jamboree (Tentative).

RAJASTHAN NIGHT :

Traditional Culture of Rajasthan will be presented on 4th January, 2023 night depicting its Folk dances & Music.

PADHARO MHARE DESH (WELCOME TO MY COUNTRY) :

04 Scouts + 01 Leader and 04 Guides + 01 Leader under Operation Solidarity 'Padharo Mhare Desh (Welcome to My Country)' – A sponsorship programme is accorded by Rajasthan State Bharat Scouts and Guides to all the National Scout Organization and Member Organization of WOSM & WAGGGS.

HOME HOSPITALITY :

For the first time in the Jamboree, home hospitality program is arranged for overseas participants to experience living with the tribal inhabitants of Pali District and learn about its rich cultural heritage.



13. ADDITIONAL POINTS TO BE LOOKED INTO

1. Proper use of sanitary Block, flush after the usage- Keep toilets/bathing area clean.
2. Use of Water- Use water as per need, please do not waste it.
3. Fire precaution in use of gas, fire-wood. No open Flames in the tents.
4. Shopping area will be provided to facilitate purchases in Jamboree market.
5. Scout/Guide equipment sale will be available for the participants.
6. Restricted visit to Overseas Sub-Camp. Exchange friendship during activity hours.
7. Maintenance of Tents- Take additional care to avoid damage to the tents.
8. Drainage and proper up-keep of State kitchen should be maintained.
9. "Out - pass" will be available only in case of emergency request through proper channel.
10. Return Journey- Ensure your return reservations well in advance.
11. Inoculation is a precautionary measure to have it before you start for the Jamboree.
12. Beware of outsiders roaming- Please report to appropriate authority if observed.
13. Sufficient Masks and hand sanitizer should be carried by all. Use Mask during gathering.
